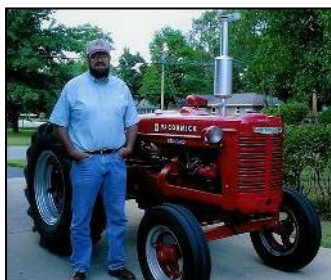

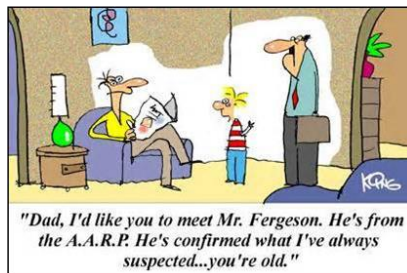

Answer to Last Month's Trivia

This Tractor began production in Louisville, Kentucky in late 1947. Nearly 135,000 rolled off the assembly line over the next four years. HALF of the purchases were first-time tractor buyers replacing horses or mules on farms where this was the only tractor. Can you name that make and model? The Farmall Cub, was created to meet a need for a compact machine meant for the small 2 or 3 horse farm.
